Acts 1:1 "The first account I composed, Theophilus, about all that Jesus began to do and teach.."

Luke 1:1-4 "Inasmuch as many have undertaken to compile an account of the things accomplished among us, 2 just as they were handed down to us by those who from the beginning were eyewitnesses and servants of the word, 3 it seemed fitting for me as well, having investigated everything carefully from the beginning, to write it out for you in consecutive order, most excellent Theophilus; 4 so that you may know the exact truth about the things you have been taught."

Col. 4:11,14 "and *also* Jesus who is called Justus; these are the only fellow workers for the kingdom of God who are from the circumcision, and they have proved to be an encouragement to me."

14 "Luke, the beloved physician, sends you his greetings, and *also* Demas."

- Originally, Luke's two books circulated together as one complete work, though they were probably on two scrolls.
- Then early in the second century, the four gospels were gathered and began to circulate together.
- It was in the latter part of the second century that Acts came to be known as "Acts of the Apostles."

- Upheld the apostle Paul but repudiated the other apostles
