Time of Writing: Early 50s AD
Written from Corinth

Paul was there about a year and 6 months

Delivered by Timothy
One of the first epistles written by Paul

- Major divisions of the book:
 - 1:1-3:13 : Paul's gratitude, concern, and relief concerning the Thessalonians
 - 4:1-5:28 : Instructions concerning their behavior and topics of concern, and concluding remarks
