JONAH'S MESSAGE FOR ISRAEL Jonah 1-2

THE AUDIENCE OF THE BOOK

- This book is not written to the Assyrians.
- The very premise of the story might shock the sensibilities of the Jews.
- God did not want Canaan destroyed because of racism (Deut. 9:4-5).
- Israel ought to have been a light to the world around them (Lev. 19:33-34).

THE STORM

- We see firstly that Jonah could choose to follow God or not.
- Consider a comparison with Acts 27.
- This is Jonah's greatest moment (Jonah 1:12).

THE SALVATION

- Notice the salvation first of those on the boat.
- Then consider the salvation of Jonah.
- Think of the lesson for Israel (and for us).
