 - How?

 - What is ultimately received is not what was initially expected.

- How does godly wisdom “call aloud” to us today?

Proverbs 1:20-33 (cont.)

- What are the consequences of rejecting Wisdom's call? (vv. 24-32)
- Where does hating knowledge lead? (vv. 22, 29)

Proverbs 2:1-9

- How should wisdom be valued?
- Who is the source of wisdom? (v. 6)
- What benefits are gained by receiving wisdom?

Proverbs 2:10-22

- From what or whom does wisdom protect us?
- What tool does the seductress use in v. 16?
- Why is it effective?

Proverbs 2:10-22 (cont.)

- What two failures of relationship has the strange woman committed that contribute to her behavior? (2:17)
- What could be a possible outcome if we allow similar weaknesses of these relationships in our lives?
- Where does association with the strange woman lead? (2:18-19)
