Rilemon An Appeal in Love

• He is appealing to a good man in whom he has confidence (v. 5-7, 21).

- The preference is appeal because of love (v. 8-9, 14).
- He highlights his own condition (v. 1, 9-10, 13).
- He shows his great affection for Onesimus (v. 10, 12).
- Onesimus has lived up to his name (v. 11, 20).
- Philemon's view of Onesimus needed to shift (v. 15-16).
- To help with this Paul uses himself as an example (v. 17-20).
- He adds that he will probably have to look Paul in the face at some point (v. 22).

• We were useless, but have been made useful (2 Tim. 2:21).
