 - Day after day, night after night (v. 2)
 - For all to see (v. 4)

Communication through His Creation (19:1-6)

- 3. What poetic descriptions does he use for the sun in verse five?
 - Bridegroom coming from his chamber
 - Strong man ready to run his race
 - In verse 6, nothing is hidden from the sphere of His influence and control. (Is. 45:5-8)

- 4. In verses 7-9, what adjectives does David use as he expresses his love for all of God's communication with man?
 - Law of the Lord is perfect
 - Testimony is sure, trustworthy (NIV), reliable (NET)
 - Precepts are right, fair (NET)
 - Commandment is <u>pure</u>, radiant (NIV, HCSB)
 - Fear of the Lord is <u>clean</u>, pure (NIV, HCSB)
 - Judgements are <u>true</u> and <u>righteous altogether</u>, firm (NIV), trustworthy and absolutely just (NET), reliable (HCSB)

- 5. From the same verses, what are the effects listed for God's word, His law and judgments, as well as the fear and respect He commands?
 - Restoring the soul
 - Making wise the simple
 - Rejoicing the heart
 - Enlightening the eyes
 - Enduring forever

- 6. How does he describe the worth of all these things?
 - Worth more than any amount of gold
 - Sweeter than honey straight from the honeycomb

 - A warning for those who would serve. (v. 11)
 - When obeyed, they bring great reward. (v. 11)
 - A consciousness of sin. (v. 12)
 - A restraint for the servant of God. (v. 13)
 - Leading to righteousness. (v. 13)
 - Reverence, appreciation, and love. (v. 14)
