9. How did the Jews in Rome receive Paul's preaching concerning Jesus?

10. Where does the quote in 28:26, 27 come from? What point was Paul making by appealing to this passage?

11. What arrangements did Paul enjoy during the time of his imprisonment in Rome?

12. Which epistles did Paul write during this time in prison in Rome?
