

WHAT HAPPENED

- Jesus died, His soul departed to somewhere, then His body and soul were reunited (Jn. 19:30; Lk. 23:43).
- The tomb was found empty (Matt. 28:1-8; Lk 24:1-9).
- This was attested by His enemies (Matt. 28:11-15).
- He appeared to many (1 Cor. 15:3-8).
- He could be touched and held (Matt. 28:9; Lk. 24:39; Jn. 20:16-17).
- He ate food (Lk. 24:41-43).
- But His body was changed (1 Cor. 15:42-45, 51-53; 1 Jn. 3:2).

WHEN DID IT HAPPEN

- In a time when pagans believed in afterlife, but not resurrection.
- The "son of god" was Caesar.
- The Pharisees believed in resurrection and the Sadducees did not.
- Women were not reliable witnesses.

WHAT DOES IT MEAN

- It is the key proof that leads to the movement that still exists to this day (Rom. 1:4).
- It is the death of death (1 Cor. 15:53-57).
- God has fulfilled all the promises to Israel.
- His resurrection is the guarantee of ours.
