What is "Resurrection"

"Bodily raising of a person from the dead to a qualitatively different type of life in which death and decay no longer have any effect. It is a transformation of the whole person body and soul – into being fit for God's eternal presence."

What is "Resurrection"

 Figurative resurrection of a cause (Rev. 20:4-6; Ezekiel 37)

Spiritual resurrection, i.e. conversion to Christ (Rom. 6:3-4; Col. 2:11-13)
Physical or bodily resurrection (1 Cor. 15:1-58; 2 Cor. 5:1-4; Phil. 3:20-21) The Resurrection Gospel: Jesus Christ's Resurrection – Foundation of our Hope (15:1-11)

- Their Own Saving Faith Resurrection of Christ (15:1-2).
- <u>Testimony of the Scriptures</u> Resurrection of Christ (15:3, 4).
- <u>Testimony of Eye-Witnesses</u> Resurrection of Christ (15:5-8).

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Consequences of the Denial of a Future Bodily Resurrection

- If there is no resurrection, then Christ is not risen (15:12).
- If Christ has not been raised:
 - Our preaching is vain (15:14, 17).
 - Your faith is worthless or useless (15:14, 17).
 - Apostles were liars (15:15).
 - Sin's Power has not been broken (15:17).
 - Dead in Christ have perished (15:18).
 - Christians are pitiful people (15:19).

The Truth: "But now Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who are asleep" (15:20)

The Resurrection Gospel: Essential to the Fulfillment of God's Plan of Redemption

Redeemer (15:20)

- Jesus serves as the "first-fruits" of those that have died (Revelation 1:18).
- Just as the first fruits are the earnest of later harvesting, so the resurrection of Christ is the guarantee of our resurrection" (Dictionary of the Apostolic Church 1:411; see TDNT 1:484-486).

The Resurrection Gospel: Essential to the Fulfillment of God's Plan of Redemption

Redeemer (15:20)

- The term "asleep" refers to a condition of the body as a result of the departure of the spirit (2 Corinthians 5:6, 8).
- Jesus's resurrection is our guarantee of our own bodily resurrection.

The Resurrection Gospel: Essential to the Fulfillment of God's Plan of Redemption

Redeemed (15:23)

 Christ's resurrection came first, then those that are Christ's will be raised *"at his coming,"* which will be the *"end."*

 Both 15:23 and 15:51 speak of the Second and Final Coming of the Lord. The Resurrection gospel: Essential to the Fulfillment of God's Plan of Redemption • Redemption (15:24-28)

 Christ will present through the resurrection - the glorified saints to the Father – so that the Father's divine purpose might be consummated – "victory over death" and Jesus will in eternity "be subject" to His Father so that all may acknowledge His work as the Redeemer to the glory of His God" (15:28). The Resurrection Gospel: Reviewing Paul's Line of Argumentation

- The Resurrection of Christ is an essential belief of the gospel (15:1-11).
- If there is no resurrection Christ could not have been raised and this would have tragic consequences (15:12-19).
- God's Sovereign Redemptive Plan Demands a Future Resurrection (15:20-28).

resurrected body we will receive according to the scriptures (I John 3:1-2; Philippians

3:20-21).

The Resurrection Gospel: *The Resurrection Body – Questions & Answers* What Happens To Those Living on the Earth When the Lord Returns? (15:51-58)

- We will not all die, but we must all be changed (15:51; I Thessalonians 4:13-18)
- The change will occur in the "twinkling of an eye" (15:52)
- There will be a change in our attributes, not our essence or person (15:53-54).
- Spiritual victory will be ours (15:57-58)
