

SCORN AS AN ARGUNIENT

- Richard Dawkins wants you to know that believing in God is delusional.
- Scorn is not a valid argument, it is often an avoidance of argument (Jn. 9:34).
- But there are things that truly are deserving of ridicule (1 Kgs. 18:27).
- Children of promise will always be the subject of ridicule (Gen. 21:9; Gal. 4:29; 2 Pet. 3:3).



EVOLUTION EXPLAINS IT ALL

- That is no exaggeration of Dawkins' position.
- Regarding the evidence for evolution (Gen. 1:31).
- What we actually observe is what the Bible describes ((Gen. 1:12, 21, 24-25; Psa. 94:9).
- But where does all this belief in deity come from (Ecc. 3:11)?



GOD IS TOO IMPROBABLE

- "The central argument of my book" (157)
- There are good and bad arguments for the existence of God.
- There is no neutral ground from which to start (Ex. 3:13-14; Psa. 14:1).
- God is the one safe assumption to start with.
