11. What change in man's diet is noted at the beginning of chapter 9?


- Meat added

- First significance of blood
- Murder a capital offense



12. When Noah became drunk, which son disrespected his father and what was the result?

- Ham
- He was cursed while his brothers were blessed





13. What was the intent of the people who gathered in the land of Shinar? (11:2-3) How did the Lord respond?

- "Let us make for ourselves a name, otherwise we will be scattered abroad..."
- Confused their languages, causing them to scatter






- 1. What was the Lord's command to Abram and how did he respond (11:31-12:9; Acts 7:2-4; Heb. 11:8)?
 - "Go forth from your country... to a land I will show you"
 - He went, "as the LORD had spoken to him"
 - He did so by faith (Heb. 11:8)



2. From the first nine verses, what were the promises God made to Abram?

- "To a land I will show you" (v. 1)
- "I will make you a great nation" (v. 2)
- "I will bless you"
- "Make your name great"
- "So you shall be a blessing"
 - "I will bless those who bless you, And the one who curses you I will curse" (v. 3)
 - "In you all the families of the earth will be blessed"



3. From Paul's letter to the Galatians, who was the ultimate fulfillment of the seed promise made here? (Gal. 3:8, 16)


Christ

• Gal. 3:8... "preached the gospel beforehand to Abraham, saying, "All the nations will be blessed in you"

• 3:16... "He does not say, "And to seeds," as referring to many, but rather to one, "And to your seed," that is,

Christ."

• Acts 3:24-25... "And likewise, all the prophets who have spoken, from Samuel and his successors onward, also announced these days. It is you who are the sons of the prophets and of the covenant which God made with your fathers, saying to Abraham, "AND IN YOUR SEED ALL THE FAMILIES OF THE EARTH SHALL BE BLESSED."





4. What does the account of Abram's actions in Egypt indicate to you regarding his faith? 5. How might we see God's faithfulness in this account?


- Work in progress
- "I will bless those who bless... curse those who curse"
- No rebuke mentioned, only God's care and faithfulness



6. What issue arose in this chapter?

- Abram described as very rich in livestock (v. 2)
- "Lot... also had flocks and herds and tents" (v. 5)
- "The land could not sustain them while dwelling together" (v. 6)
- "And there was strife between the herdsmen" (v. 7)





- Chose the well-watered valley of the Jordan to the east
- "Lot dwelt in the cities of the plain and pitched his tent even as far as Sodom" (NKJV)
- The first description of the wickedness Sodom given here (v. 13)



8. What promises are repeated to Abram? (v. 14-18)

Land and nation

All the land he could see would be given to his descendants

They would number as the dust of the earth



- 9. What happened that made it necessary for Abram to rescue Lot, his family, and possessions?
 - Rebellion against the control of the kings from the east
 - Sodom and Gomorrah fell
 - Lot and his possessions taken as the cities were pillaged



10. To whom are we briefly introduced at the end of the chapter and who was he? (v. 18-20)

- Melchizedek
- King of Salem and priest of God (v. 18)
- Blessed Abram and received 1/10 of the spoils



11. What similarities does the Hebrew writer highlight between he and Christ?

- King of righteousness (Heb. 7:2; Jer. 23:5-6; 1 Cor. 1:30)
- King of peace (Heb. 7:2; Isa. 9:6-7; Eph. 2:14-15)
- Both priest and king (Heb. 8:1-2; Rev. 17:14)

Genesis 11:27-14:24

- Not of priestly lineage/priest forever (Heb. 7:14-17; Psa. 110)
- Greater than Abraham (Heb. 7:4-7;
 Jn. 8:53ff)
 - A figure or type of Christ
