What Is the Will of God?

- The word translated "will" (Gr. *thelēma*) simply means "desire, intention, or wish" (e.g., free will; Ephesians 5:17 NLT).
- We know that God is a volitional being because ...
 - 1. The universe evidences a purposeful design, which implies an intentional designer (Psalm 19:1-6; Romans 1:19-21).
 - 2. Humanity possesses free will and moral conscientiousness, which are inexplicable without a spiritual creator (Genesis 1:26).
- If God is a willful being and has created us in his image, we can reasonably infer that he would communicate to us his desires for us (Acts 17:24-31).



God, who made the world and everything in it, since He is Lord of heaven and earth, does not dwell in temples made with hands. Nor is He worshiped with men's hands, as though He needed anything, since He gives to all life, breath, and all things. ...

Has God Revealed His Will?

• The testimony of the prophets, the apostles, and Jesus Christ affirm that God has communicated his will to us (e.g., "Thus says the LORD," Exodus 4:22; 2 Peter 1:21; John 1:18).



For prophecy never came by the will of man, but holy men of God spoke as they were moved by the Holy Spirit. 2 Peter 1:21 NKJV



No one has seen God at any time. The only begotten Son, who is in the bosom of the Father, He has declared Him. John 1:18 NKJV

All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work. 2 Timothy 3:16-17 NKJV



But God has revealed them to us through His Spirit. For the Spirit searches all things, yes, the deep things of God. For what man knows the things of a man except the spirit of the man which is in him? Even so no one knows the things of God except the Spirit of God....



Now we have received, not the spirit of the

world, but the Spirit who is from God, that we might know the things that have been freely given to us by God. These things we also speak, not in words which man's wisdom teaches but which the Holy Spirit teaches, comparing spiritual things with spiritual.

- God has spoken in a way that we can understand; he demands, then, that we know and practice what he desires (Ephesians 5:17; Matthew 7:21-27).

For I have not spoken on My own authority; but the Father who sent Me gave Me a command, what I should say and what I should speak. John 12:49 NKJV



Then Jesus answered and said to them, "Most assuredly, I say to you, the Son can do nothing of Himself, but what He sees the Father do; for whatever He does, the Son also does in like manner."

John 5:19 NKJV



I can of Myself do nothing. As I hear, I judge; and My judgment is righteous, because I do not seek My own will but the will of the Father who sent Me. John 5:30 NKJV



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- The words of God in Scripture communicate in the same ways that we speak to one another; he tells (statements and commands), shows (examples), and implies (implications) what he wants from us (John 12:49; 5:19, 30).
- Our duty is to read the Bible, to interpret it correctly, and to obey it (1 Timothy 4:13; 2 Timothy 2:15; 2 Peter 3:15-18; Romans 12:2; cf. Acts 8:30-31).

Till I come, give attention to reading, to exhortation, to doctrine. 1 Timothy 4:13 NKJV



Be diligent to present yourself approved to God, a worker who does not need to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth. 2 Timothy 2:15 NKJV



And consider that the longsuffering of our Lord is salvation- as also our beloved brother Paul, according to the wisdom given to him, has written to you, as also in all his epistles, speaking in them of these things, in which are some things hard to understand, which untaught and unstable people twist to their own destruction, as they

do also the rest of the Scriptures....



You therefore, beloved, since you know this beforehand, beware lest you also fall from

your own steadfastness, being led away with the error of the wicked; but grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To Him be the glory both now and forever. Amen.
