- Introduction: Questions about gender are relevant to both ancient and modern cultures (Deut 22:5; e.g., Nero/Sporus). One recent term that needs attention is "non-binary gender."
- **Definition:** The phrase "non-binary gender" is synonymous with "genderqueer," falls within the realm of transgenderism, and differs from cisgender and intersex.
 - -The sexual orientation of non-binary individuals is variable (i.e., "heterosexual," "homosexual," bisexual).
 - Non-binary individuals may label their gender (1) intermediate or separate, (2) multiple, (3) absent, or (4) fluctuating (i.e., genderfluid).

• **Defense:** Some claim that the Bible defends the non-binary identity (or ideology). The major proof texts are as follows:

God created man in His own image, in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them.

(Gen 1:27 NASB)

Proponents claim that the apparent binary language in the creation story contextually allows for a spectrum of genders.

• **Defense:** Some claim that the Bible defends the non-binary identity (or ideology). The major proof texts are as follows:

I will give thanks to You, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made; Wonderful are Your works, And my soul knows it very well.

(Ps 139:14 NASB)

Proponents claim that God created the body and the mind, including the varying gender identities.

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There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is no male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus. (Gal 3:28 ESV)

Proponents claim that Christians ought no longer to recognize binary gender models (or allow power dynamics that divide the church).

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Proponents also claim that God is an ungendered spiritual being (who is, in fact, three persons in one) and that humans, therefore, need not maintain binary gender distinctions.

- **Answer:** Christians must determine whether the preceding interpretations are viable, and if they are not, answer them. We will consider them in the order presented.
 - -**Genesis 1:27:** A spectrum of genders (and of times and locations) is nonexistent in the immediate and remote context of Gen 1 (Gen 1:1, 5, 10; 2:7, 15, 22-24; 5:1-2; 6:19; Matt 19:4-5; 1 Cor 11:7-9, 11-12).
 - **Psalm 139:14:** The argument begins with the unproven premises that biological gender has little to do with identity and that God implants non-binary minds in individuals (Gen 1:27; Rom 1:26-27).
 - **Galatians 3:28:** Paul recognizes that males and females are different-just as Jews and Gentiles and slaves and freemen differ-but denies that gender precludes salvation and unity in Christ.

- **Answer:** Christians must determine whether the preceding interpretations are viable, and if they are not, answer them. We will consider them in the order presented.
 - **Genesis 1:27:** God is not gendered in a biological sense-though Jesus was in the incarnation-but he reveals himself in exclusively masculine (i.e., binary) terms (1 Cor 11:7; Eph 4:4-6; cf. Isa 66:13).

- **Summary and Conclusions:** The Bible does not affirm a non-binary gender ideology. God create humanity to be male or female. Men and women today can be one in Christ, but they cannot ignore divinely appointed gender distinctions.
 - -Those who adopt or accept non-binary gender identities distort and reject Scripture to their own destruction (Rom 1:21; 2 Pet 3:16).
 - As Christians, our responsibility is ...
 - To love those who have become entangled in sin and try to convince them of their folly (Jude 22-23; Gal 6:1; Jas 5:19-20).
 - To stand for and preach the truth as it is revealed in the Bible-regardless of the consequences (Jude 3; Eph 4:14-15; 2 Tim 1:8).
