- Amid everyday challenges, we can sometimes lose sight of the fact that children are a gift from God Ps 127:3–5; Deut 7:12–14. Challenge #1: Evaluate our thinking!
- God sees children not only as gifts to be given but as persons to be loved, and he especially loves little ones Mark 10:13–16; cf. Luke 18:15; Titus 2:4; 2 Tim 3:3.
  Challenge #2: Learn to love children as God does!
- Raising children is sometimes difficult and discouraging, but God intends for our children to give us joy Ps 113:9; Gen 21:6–7; Prov 23:24. Challenge #3: Rejoice!

Challenge #4: Express our love and joy for our children!

Older women likewise are to be reverent in their behavior, not malicious gossips nor enslaved to much wine, teaching what is good, so that they may instruct the young women in sensibility: to love their husbands, to love their children, to be sensible, pure, workers at home, kind, being subject to their own husbands, so that the word of God will not be slandered.
