## Sunday Belongs to Jesus Rev 1:10

## The Lord's Day

- The phrase "the Lord's day" occurs only once in the New Testament and undoubtedly refers to the first day of the week (Rev 1:10).

1. The word transated "Lords"s comnects "Hhe Lord's day" to ""he Lord"s supper," a first-day-0:-the-week observance (1 Cor 11:20; Acts 20:7).
2. The first day of the week was linked directly to the resurrection of the Lord and the establishment of his church (John 20:1, 19, 26; Acts 2:1).

The eighth day [Sunday] is the beginning of another world; and therefore with joy we celebrate the eighth day, on which Jesus rose from the dead. (Barnabas, c. AD 75)

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3. Christians gathered on the first day of the week (Acts 20:7; 1 Cor 16:2).

On the Lord's Day all Christians in the city and country meet together, because that is the day of our Lorr's resurrection; and then we read the Apostes and Prophets. This being done, the president makes an oration to the assembly to exhort them to imitate and to pracice the things which they have heard, and then we all join in prayer, and after that we celebrate the Lord's Supper; then they who are able and willing give what they think proper, and what is collected is laid up in the hands of the president, who distributes it to the orphans, and widows, and other necessitous Christians as their wants require.
(Justin Nartyr, c. AD 150)

From the beginning the Christians assembled on the first day of the week, called by them the Lord's Day, to read the Scriptures, to preach, and to celebrate the Lord's Supper. (Iranaeus, c. AD 180)

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- The word translated "Lord's" means "belonging to the Lord."

The word "Lord's" means "belonging to the Lord [or] the Lori'l's" and was "often used in inscriptions and papyri to mean imperial," [e.g., of] the imperial treasury, service, etc." (BDAG).

## Dedicate Sunday to Jesus!

- If the first day of the week is "the Lord's day", then it belongs to Jesss, not us, and we must commit every Sunday to him. How do we do so?

1. We must set apart the Lori's day for Christ by prioritiongg the Sunday worship assemblies (Acts 20:7a; cf. vv. 6, 16; Heb 10:23-25).
2. We must prepare for the Iord's day in advance by readying ourselves for worship before we arrive (e.g, Saturday; Acts 20:7b; Heb 10:22).
3. We must engage in Lord's day activities by whoteceartedly participating in Bible study and worship (Acts 20:7c; c. w. 8-9; John 4:23-24).

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
