Matthew 23-28

CURSES ON JERUSALEM

- The woes pronounced here correspond to the curses of Deut. 28 (Matt. 23).
- The conclusion of the woes connects to Deut. 32:11. (Matt. 23:37).
- Jesus then turns His attention to the destruction of Jerusalem (Matt. 24:1; Deut. 28:52).
- The signs of the impending destruction are things listed in Deut. 28 (Matt. 24:6-7).
- There is also hope pronounced amid this judgment (Matt. 24:31; Deut. 30:4).
- Jesus sets blessing and curses before the people (Matt. 25:34, 41; Deut. 30:1, 19).

HUNGONATRE

- There is a linguistic connection here as we move into the next section (Matt. 26:1; Deut. 32:45).
- Several references are pointing us back to Deuteronomy as we move toward the cross
- Finally, we come to the trial and crucifixion.

FULFILLING THE LAW

- This helps us see more of what Jesus accomplished.
- It helps us see the law more clearly.
- It combats so many false doctrines.
