Cement Salvation

- Secure the Salvation of your hearers
- Secure your own Salvation!

MAJOR THEMES

Apostacy

- Myths & genealogies (speculations rather than truth)
- Wives' tales (i.e., "godless myths fit only for old women")
- Deceitful spirits, doctrines of demons, by hypocrisy of liars
 - Examples: forbidding marriage, abstaining from foods
- Any different doctrine, not agree w/ sound words

- Elder

Maturity, Experience

- Pastor (to shepherd/feed) Guarding, Feeding
- Presbytery

Transliterated presbuteros = elders

<u>Deacon</u>

Transliterated diakonos = servant

- Temperate
- Sober-minded/sensible
- Respectable
- Hospitable
- Able to teach
- Not addicted to wine
- Not violent
- Considerate
- Peaceable
- Not greedy
- Lead household well, children in submission w/ all dignity
- Not a novice
- Good reputation (beyond church)

Deacons

- Dignified
- Not double-tongued
- Not indulging in much wine
- Not fond of dishonest gain
- Faith w/ clear conscience
- Beyond reproach
- One wife
- Lead children and households well

<u>Their Wives</u>

- Dignified
- Not malicious gossips
- Temperate
- Faithful in all things



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
